NGOs and Support Services

There are several charities that offer support for victims and survivors of modern slavery, human trafficking, and exploitation. Support can include access to safe housing, support with accessing medical care, legal assistance, counselling services and other therapeutic services, and vocational training. The Liberty Project, Bournemouth Churches Housing Association (BCHA)

The Liberty Project, run by BCHA in the south-west region, acts as a crucial support system for potential survivors of modern-day slavery and human trafficking. Their extensive network helps clients residing in their safe houses as well as through outreach efforts, ensuring accessibility for those in need. Specialising in aiding individuals referred to the National Referral Mechanism (NRM), the project offers a variety of services tailored to meet the unique needs of survivors, including secure accommodation, medical care, legal support, and holistic rehabilitation programmes.
