What is the Dorset Anti-Slavery Partnership?

Throughout the country, various public sector bodies unite to combat modern slavery and exploitation. The Dorset Anti-Slavery Partnership began in 2016 and aimed to establish a robust platform for collaboration across Dorset on issues concerning trafficking and slavery. Over time, these organisations have created robust networks for sharing information and fostering effective collaboration among Local Authorities, Dorset Police and public sector bodies. Through collective efforts, these organisations adopt a multi-agency approach to address concerns and are better positioned to develop a comprehensive understanding of the prevalence of modern slavery, both in individual cases and across Dorset as a whole.
